IMPORTANT MESSAGE RE ADELAIDE AIRPORT ENTRY CARDS YOU CAN APPLY NOW.

A brochure produced by Adelaide Airport Limited, outlining full information is available from the Taxi Council SA or from your CBS.

It is important that you note that Adelaide Airport Limited will be administering the new Access Card procedures and you will need to contact them with your enquiries. The Taxi Council will be unable to assist you with the Access Card system.

AAL advise:

Drivers will be required to register with AAL, provide evidence of accreditation, set up a new virtual wallet and agree to a monthly account administration fee of \$1.50.

The indicative cost of involvement in the new access control system is as follows:

Access Card \$25 (non-refundable)

Entry fees to the taxi area will be levied at the current tariffs but may be subject to review from time to time.

Monthly administration fee will be levied at \$1.50 per calendar month but may be subject to review from time to time.

Drivers will need to access [www.adelaideairport.com.au.access](http://www.adelaideairport.com.au/access) to commence the application and accreditation process. Further terms and conditions are outlined in the application process. The accreditation process may be commenced immediately.

Important additional Information:

T-Tags will still be operational but AAL encourage you to move to the card access system as soon as possible.

The monthly administration fee of \$1.50 will not be applied until the first day of the month following the closure of the T-Tag system. The monthly administration fee will then be applied on the first day of each calendar month thereafter.

AAL require up to 10 working days after receipt of a correctly completed accreditation application to post an access card to the applicant.

Any driver who has not taken the opportunity to become accredited with AAL for entry to the taxi area under the new access control system may ultimately be denied entry to that area.

T-Tags will ultimately be phased out and replaced with the Access Card. We will keep you informed as the transition progresses.
